Editorial Committee- The chair presented a list of the current associate editors of journals who are serving the TCMU: JASA (Joe Wolfe, Thom Moore, and Andy Morrison), JASA-EL (Murray Campbell), POMA (Randy Worland). The editors were thanked for their service and the members of the TCMU were encouraged to continue to serve as reviewers.

Women in Acoustics- Judy Cottingham reported on the WIA outreach activities. She specifically mentioned: WIA has two grant programs: Young Investigator Travel grants – four are given at each meeting and a Dependent Care grant – based on need, also four of these given at each meeting.
